Dear Dan Price,

Thank you for your letter we received on the 1<sup>st</sup> June, addressed to the Minister for Rural Affairs and North Wales and Trefnydd. I have been asked to respond in my capacity as Forestry Policy Support Manager for the Welsh Government.

As your letter describes, Distribution Network Operators (DNOs) are required by law to keep distribution power lines free of vegetation and undertake programmes of resilience clearance and felling works to safely maintain power supply (as per the Electricity Supply Quality and Continuity Regulations 2002).

Since we received your letter, I understand Western Power have been in contact with local residents (on 10<sup>th</sup> June) to discuss issues raised and answer their questions. Western Power's report outlined their environmental assessment and resilience strategy regarding 'key routes' (representing 100km of the 6000km maintained by the DNO), where lines must be maintained to the higher specifications of clearance.

If you or your residents remain unsatisfied with their response and would like to escalate your complaint, the Energy Ombudsman is the next step in this formal process. For your convenience, please find attached a link to Ofgem's webpages which explain the complaints process in greater detail.
